


CONTINUING THE JOURNEY

We facilitate visits for Year 5 and 6 students to acquaint themselves with our school premises and community. This initiative aims to address any concerns they may have about transitioning.

In preparation for their enrollment in September, our staff members visit our feeder primary schools to establish connections with the students. Moreover, we offer a series of transition activities spanning three days in June. Additionally, we host an information evening for parents to meet our staff, current students, and tour our facilities.

Once students commence Year 7 at our school, they are placed under the guidance of their head of year and registration tutors to ensure a smooth transition process.

ADMISSIONS POLICY

Places are reserved at the school for students who have completed their education at Welsh medium primary schools within the catchment area. Additionally, a limited number of positions are allocated for students transitioning from English medium primary schools within the Wrexham area to the 'Language Immersion Scheme.'

IMMERSION PROGRAMME

Commencing from the Summer term of the students' final year in Primary school, this program facilitates a smooth transition into Year 7. Our objective is to ensure that immersion students are fully integrated into our Welsh medium educational system by their third year.

CURRICULUM

Pupils in years 7-9 are taught in line with The Curriculum for Wales guidance. There are four purposes at the heart of the Curriculum, namely to develop:

- Ambitious, capable learners, ready to learn throughout their lives.
- Enterprising, creative contributors, ready to play a full part in life and work.
- Ethical, informed citizens of Wales and the world.
- Healthy, confident individuals, ready to lead fulfilling lives as valued members of society.

This corresponds with the school's vision to create, 'A proud, welcoming community that is passionate about each individual's ability to achieve their potential and ambition, and to develop into a happy, confident, independent and responsible member of their society.'

The school provides lessons for pupils within the Six Areas of Learning and Experience, namely: Performing Arts, Languages and Literacy, Health and Well-being, Science and Technology, Mathematics and Numeracy, and Humanities. Subjects such as Personal and Social Education, Religion and Ethics, and Relationships and Sexuality Education are taught within these areas as well as during registration sessions and during occasional events.



CURRICULUM

Key Stage 4

As our students move from KS3 to KS4, they will experience the schools options process. Parents information evenings are held so that information can be shared and a discussion between the student, parents and staff can take place.

The process starts in the Spring term of year 9. In addition to the option subjects, students will study our core subjects; Mathematics, Science, English, Welsh, Physical Education and Religious Education. They will also follow the Welsh Baccalaureate.

Our aim during this process is that each student chooses the correct pathway that suits their ability, talents, interests and ambitions.



THE SIXTH **FORM**

Ysgol Morgan Llwyd's Sixth Form offers a diverse array of subjects, providing students with valuable educational opportunities and a breadth of life experiences. Our sixth form upholds high standards concerning education, behavior, and dedication.

Consistently achieving commendable A Level results, the school has surpassed national averages in recent years. A significant proportion of our graduates proceed to pursue higher education, with our strong affiliations with universities, local businesses, and industry professionals contributing substantially to our achievements. Among the contributing factors to our sixth form's success is the unwavering support and guidance provided by our dedicated staff.

Our curriculum encompasses a wide range of courses, including AS/A Levels, BTEC vocational courses, and the Welsh Baccalaureate, ensuring a comprehensive academic offering for our students.


STUDENT SUPPORT/ THE PASTORAL HUB

THE LEARNING **HUB**

Everyone needs help with their school work every now and then. This is why we established the Leaning Hub at Ysgol Morgan Llwyd. Our mission is to ensure that EVERY PUPIL can access extra help to acquire the skills needed to reach their full potential.

The Teaching and Learning Hub supports our pupils' existing learning experiences and provides our learners with opportunities to foster and consolidate the skills needed to make the most of their education. We can – and do – organise and implement bespoke academic support to help our pupils to fulfil their academic goals.

THE LEARNING **HUB**

We offer:

- Mentoring sessions for pupils of all ages and ability to gain a better understanding of their work.
- "Catch up" sessions for pupils who have been absent from school.
- Workshops and resources to help pupils to develop new skills, including how to revise for external exams.
- Seren Network/MAT (More able and talented) activities.
- Opportunities for pupils to contribute to the Learning Hub's work by becoming a Learning Mentor.
- Resources to help pupils stay positive and resilient during periods when schoolwork is particularly difficult.
- Breaktime and lunchtime clubs, e.g. Chess Club, Languages Club, Acting Club, Reading Club, Rubik's Cube Club, Creative Writing Club, Crochet Club, and many more...
- A large, quiet, comfortable, modern space in which to work as well as seven glass "pods" that are ideal spaces for independent work, workshops and meetings.



A HEALTHY SCHOOL

The school canteen is open from 8:30-8:45 for simple breakfast options, break time and lunchtime. We provide a system where students can choose their meals from a daily menu for the cost of around £2.80. They have ample opportunity to opt for a variety of healthy food and drinks. Students are also welcome to bring a packed lunch.

A bio-metric thumb recognition system is implemented which allows the canteen to run smoothly.

Performing Arts:

The school provides excellent opportunities in the performing arts. In addition to the vocal and instrumental lessons provided by Wrexham Music Service, the Music and Drama departments provide students with memorable experiences e.g school shows and Eisteddfods.

The school has a variety of choirs for the younger and older students, as well as recitation and dramatic performance groups. Individual students also excel through the Urdd and National Eisteddfod stages.





BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

Sports:

The Physical Education Department offers a wide variety of sporting activities that can to appeal to every student; the department also upholds a high standard regarding it's uniform especially when students are representing the school during sporting events.

Sports such as rugby, football, cricket, netball, athletics, badminton, fitness and orienteering are offered to all students. These take place within PE lessons and as well as extra-curricular activities.

CAREERS GUIDANCE

At Ysgol Morgan Llwyd, we firmly believe that Careers and World of Work Education (WOW) is an integral part of the development of a young person.

Choosing the correct pathway is important as students go through the options process in Year 9, 11 and Sixth Form as they decide on the next step after leaving school.

All students from year 9 upwards receive specific advisory sessions in regards to GCSE's, A-Level's, college and University applications. In year 11 each student will receive a formal mock-interview by members of the professional and business communities.

For our Sixth Formers, as well as interviews provided by Careers Wales, students will be supported and mentored by an experienced member of staff as they tackle their UCAS university applications as well as researching opportunities for work and apprenticeships.





RELIGIOUS EDUCATION & ASSEMBLIES

All students are expected to attend weekly year group assemblies as well as whole school assemblies that are held twice a term.

The curriculum's Religious Education content is provided through Religious Education lessons and 'Pause for thought' sessions. Weekly year group assemblies are an opportunity to celebrate success and share key information as well as a time to reflect on current affairs and values.

Parents have the right to withdraw their child from these experiences for reasons of conscience by making a written request to the Headteacher.

ALN/ CAMAU

One of Ysgol Morgan Llwyd's priorities is improving the abilities, achievements and contributions of all pupils as well as helping them raise their aspirations. CHARGING POLICY
